We provide opportunities to connect with community through our in person meetings, and virtual spaces, and come together to provide community sourced resources.

The BEAVER Lodge - Boisterous Events & Activities for Vibrant & Eager queers, R rated! A Queer group based on community guideposts designed to operate from abundance, generosity and empathy with a big dash of silliness and an F Yes energy. 18 + for Queer/LGBT + identified women and non-binary individuals living within the Kingston area.

Reelout - Celebrates queer media arts and to contribute to community vitality by programming materials that focus on issues of sexuality, race, culture, religion, class, gender, ability, health and age, thereby purposefully drawing together and initiating challenging dialogue among disparate members of the queer communities in Kingston and the surrounding area as well as between the larger Kingston community and the queer community.

<u>FUSE Youth Group</u> - Kingston's official LGBTQ2S+ youth group. FUSE exists to create a safe and fun space for all youth 12-18 years old in Kingston who identify with LGBTQ2S+ or are allies.

<u>Sexual Health Resource Center (SHRC)</u> - The SHRC is a non-profit resource that prides itself on being an inclusive, non judgemental and confidential resource for sex and sexuality in Kingston. They provide learning materials, pamphlets and as well as a variety of sexual health and pleasure products. They also serve as a confidential resource for those in need of immediate support.

CT Survivors Connect - CTSC is a compassionate and dedicated support group and service development program tailored specifically for survivors who have endured the deeply traumatic experience of conversion "therapy" in Canada. Their primary mission is to extend a warm and nurturing embrace to survivors, offering them a sanctuary of safety, unwavering support, and the utmost respect. They hold in person support meetings the first and third Wednesday of every month.

KnowHIV is about connecting people to HIV resources, and making sure no one is left behind. No new cases, and ensuring anyone living with HIV is receiving treatment and leads a long, healthy, stigma-free life.

Beers for Queers - Weekly night of friends and beer for members of Kingston's LGBT community and their allies, all identities and orientations welcome.

<u>Dragshow.ca</u> - We are passionate about drag entertainment. Drag is transformative, fun, and exciting. We want everyone in Canada to experience at least one drag show or featured drag artist event in their lifetime. It can sometimes be challenging to find a drag event nearby. Events may be advertised on social media you don't follow or on ticket selling websites you don't check. And sometimes it can be simply advertised on a printed poster at a local venue. This is where DragShow.ca comes in. We want to give people putting on drag events an opportunity to share their listing. And we want people searching for drag shows near you to find your event.

Rouge Studio of Dance - Under the guidance of "the hip-swinging fox with the fiery locks", Randi Rouge, the Rouge Studio of Dance currently offers classes in beginner burlesque, solo and group performance as well as jazz funk, heels and belly dance. We strive to create a supportive and encouraging environment where you can let loose, have fun, explore your sensuality and build your confidence -- all while improving your physical fitness.

The Rouge Studio of Dance welcomes students of all levels of experience in Ottawa, Toronto, Halifax and Kingston. Our teachers will support you whatever your goals may be -- including providing exciting opportunities to perform for adoring audiences in our regular showcases.

Our goal is to make sure everyone feels as safe and valued as possible when interacting with the group. Accordingly, we ask that folks please be respectful, non-judgmental, and keep things confidential (do not share things said here outside of the group) when posting, commenting, or discussing the group with others.

<u>Kingston Native Centre and Language Nest</u> - The Kingston Native Centre and Language Nest started in the grassroots by a local group of Indigenous language lovers and learners.

Our vision is to champion the urban resurgence of Indigenous languages through following the Kanyen'kehá:ka Kayanerenkó:wa (Great Law of Peace) and the Anishinaabe Seven Grandfather Teachings, we aim to lift each other up through peace, strength, and a collective mind, and continue to support other Indigenousled community initiatives as well as create a space of openness and acceptance for all who wish to learn.

At our building located at 218 Concession Street, Kingston – situated on the traditional territory of the Haudenosaunee and the Anishinaabe peoples – we invite you to attend our community workshops and language learning sessions.

<u>Four Directions Indigenous Student Centre</u> - Four Directions Indigenous Student Centre (4D) is the home away from home for First Nations, Inuit and Métis students on campus!

We provide study spaces, laundry, a cozy living room, and a pantry/full access kitchen. Our team facilitates cultural activities such as drumming, beading, feasts and ceremony, as well as social, academic and wellbeing programming.


